Genre: Small ensemble piece with a strong visual element

Duration: Approx. 30 minutes

FLOCK is a 30 minute small ensemble piece with a strong visual element, created for children and families of all ages.

FLOCK is centred around a suite of **newly invented playful instruments** combined with flute, cello and percussion. Opening with a sonically and visually captivating performance by the musicians, **the audience are gently encouraged to become more involved** until, through their collective effort, a chirping flock comes into being.

FLOCK evolves from explorations of the songs and calls of birds, the sounds of a woodland and the weather. Origami birds slowly flap their paper wings overhead, music boxes tinkle, automated swanee whistles twitch and flutter, accordion reeds and pipes resonate... creating an evocative and intriguing setting that builds towards the impression of a lively flock of birds tweeting and chattering together.

FLOCK was commissioned by **Red Note Ensemble** and **Sound** and developed with **Oakwood Primary School**, **Aultmore Park Primary School** and **Easterhouse families**.


Bios

Kathy Hinde is an artist and composer inspired by behaviours and phenomena found in nature and the everyday expressed through audiovisual installations and performances that combine sound, sculpture, image and light. Composed of hand-made objects, electronics and a blend of digital and analogue systems, her work represents a cross between kinetic sound sculptures and newly invented instruments. She frequently works in collaboration with other practitioners and scientists and often actively involves the audience in the creative process.

She has toured work across Europe, USA, Canada, Mexico, Brazil, Russia, China, Sri Lanka, Pakistan, Colombia, Australia and New Zealand. Awards include an Ivor Novello Award for Sound Art; an Honorary Mention at Prix Ars Electronica; a British Composer Award in Sonic Art; an ORAM award and a Scottish Award for New Music for collaboration with Maja Ratkje in 2018.

Booking Information

DURATION:

Overall running time 30 minutes (no interval). The work can be performed 2 or 3 times in one day. Post performance time should be included for the audience to interact with the instruments. This is normally 10 - 20 minutes long.

<u>Duration of reset time between performances</u>: 45 minutes

PERFORMANCE SPACE:

This is a flexible indoor performance that can suit a variety of performance spaces. Minimum playing size of the stage of 6.5m wide and 6.5m deep.



SEATING:

The preferred audience seating is on the floor within the playing space, with additional seating at the back.

The venue will need to supply appropriate floor seating, please refer to photographs for previous configurations.



ACCESSIBILITY:

Red Note strongly encourages presenting venues to ensure that venues are accessible for wheelchair users and those with reduced mobility.

Suitable viewing positions for wheelchair users should be identified and made available. Please discuss this with us in advance.

TOURING COMPANY:

Ensemble: 3 musicians

<u>Crew</u>: 1 production manager 1 company manager

ACCOMMODATION:

Single rooms (en-suite) on a bed and breakfast basis.

TRAVEL:

To be discussed with Red Note.
We encourage slow touring methods, and this should be considered when booking travel.
The promoter will arrange all local ground transfers for artists, crew and equipment to venue and accommodation.

FREIGHT:

The set travels in 2 flight cases (940mm (L) \times 630mm (W) \times 830mm (H) / weight TBC) and one suitcase.

The promoter will cover freight costs as agreed with Red Note.

LIGHTS:

There is no specific lighting for this production, a general wash should be discussed with the production manager. Contact us for a full stage specification.

GET-IN:

Set up is 3 hours (evening before performances) including get-in, assuming that all equipment asked for is in the venue, tested and in working order.

LOAD OUT:

2-3 hours

VENUE CREW REQUIRED:

- → Front of House/Usher staff for performances
- → 1 technician for get-in, set up and load out The promoter is responsible for ensuring their staff can work with children, if deemed necessary.

EQUIPMENT REQUIRED:

→ Percussion: 28-36"Bass Drum

Wind Machine

2 x suspended cymbals on stand

- \rightarrow 2 x small tables, approx. 600mm x 600mm
- \rightarrow 7 x chairs
- \rightarrow 6 x music stands
- → 2 x 13amp sockets and 1 x 13amp run to downstage left.
- → 4 x small active speakers on stands. This will be plugged into a sound desk downstage left. Please provide appropriate cables.
- \rightarrow 5 x tank trap
- \rightarrow 10 x stage weights to go on tank traps
- \rightarrow 2 x aluminium scaffold poles 4.8mm OD, length 2.4m
- \rightarrow 3 x aluminium scaffold poles 4.8mm OD, length 2.2m
